# RULES AND REGULATIONS

**ALL ENTRIES CLOSE Friday 4<sup>th</sup> February 2022 at 4pm**

Except flower, vegetable, and egg entries which close Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2022 at 4pm

General Rules and Regulations for the governance and conduct of the Franklin A & P Show shall be the same as the rules and regulations as issued by the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ (Inc) and it shall be deemed as if they had been printed in full in this Schedule. If any Exhibitor is not sure of the conditions they should get in touch with the Secretary.

**Please note that Show Dates or Classes may change due to restrictions surrounding Covid-19. Please follow our Facebook page or Website for updates.**

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

### Entries per Class:

Entries restricted to **2 entries** per class unless otherwise stated. Please read each Class details carefully. EXHIBITS may be entered in ONE class only.

### How to Enter:

### Late Entries and Refunds:

Late Entries will not be accepted. No refunds will be given for non-participation after payment has been made.

### Prize Money:

The Franklin A & P Society will not be offering prize money in any section. Each section is a Ribbon Day event only.

### Exhibitor Passes:

Each Exhibitor will receive 2 (two) Exhibitor's Passes – one for themselves and one for a supporter / assistant. All Exhibitors who can't present passes at the gate will be charged normal entry charges and there will be no refunds.

### Privacy Act:

The Society holds records and names and addresses of all members and exhibitors and will publish these as necessary for media show reports unless advised.

### Bona Fide Work:

Exhibits must be the bona fide work of the entrant and may not have been a previous prize winning entry of the Franklin A & P Show.

### Full Disclosure:

Entrants must supply their full name, address, and phone number on entry form. **ALL EXHIBITS MUST HAVE TICKET** with class number on one side and exhibitor name and Entry/Back No on the other. NB. Not the entrant number. The names of the winners may be published.

### Prizes:

A prize giving will be held at 3pm Sunday to present trophies, sashes and take photos.

### Points:

Where points prizes are awarded, points to count, 1st = 6, 2nd = 4, 3rd = 2.

### Protests:

All protests are to be lodged at the Secretary's office within 30 minutes of the event. Protests must be in writing and accompanied by a \$50.00 cash deposit. This will be refunded if the protest is upheld. Where necessary, the Franklin A & P Society will adjudicate in all matters other than judging and such a decision shall be final.

### Disclaimer:

It may be necessary to make changes to the programme, prizes or judges because of circumstances beyond our control. No correspondence will be entered into.

### Sportsmanship:

The purpose of our show is to provide our community and visiting competitors the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and competition, therefore any person or persons who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow competitors, stewards, judges or show officials may be asked, at the discretion of the show committee, to leave the showgrounds.

### Date and Time for Collecting Exhibits at

#### Completion of Show:

Exhibitors will be able to collect their Exhibits for the Home Industry section from Massey Hall on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> February 2022 from 4.15pm until 5.30pm. NO Vehicles will be allowed on the Grounds until all traders have left the grounds. Tow away rules will be in force prior to this time.

Please ensure ALL entries are collected from Massey Hall by 1.00pm on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> February 2022.

**NOTE:** People collecting exhibits must produce an Entry Form or other form of Identification. Exhibits will not be released without this.

**NOTE:** Due to Health Regulations, all perishable goods e.g. food and vegetable items will be disposed of at the close of the Show.

**Time of Judging and Judging Rules:**

**Non-Perishable** – handcraft, preserves, and the art section will be judged after 4.00pm Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2022

**Perishable** - cooking, vegetables, flowers, floral art and all children's classes will be judged after 4.00pm on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> February 2022 with the exception of the beer, wine, honey, and eggs sections as these will be judged on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> February 2022 at the show, time to be advised.

**Garden Exhibits** will be judged after 4.00pm on either Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2022 or Friday 18<sup>th</sup> February 2022. Check schedule carefully for when exhibits must be delivered.

The Society reserves the right to verify suitability of exhibits in classes. Where appropriate exhibits may be transferred to another class or disqualified.

Classes may be merged if there are insufficient entries at the Judge's or Head Steward's discretion. Judges will be accompanied by Stewards only. No visitors allowed in Massey Hall during judging.

**JUDGE'S DECISIONS ARE FINAL.** If entries are deemed to not be up to standard, prizes will not be awarded.

**Insurance:**

The Franklin A & P Society will not under any circumstances be held responsible for loss, damage or mis-delivery of goods exhibited at the Show.

**Event Cancellation:**

If the show is abandoned or postponed due to any reason beyond the control of the Show Organiser, the Show Organiser is under no obligation to refund in whole or in part any payments made by the Exhibitors. Any refund will be made at the discretion of the Franklin Agricultural and Pastoral Society.

200g softened butter

$\frac{3}{4}$  cup icing sugar

1cup flour

1 cup cornflour

$\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon baking powder

Cream butter and sugar and until light and fluffy. Sift dry ingredients.

Mix into creamed mixture.

Roll dough into balls and flatten.

Bake at 170 - 180 degrees for 20 minutes.

Sandwich two biscuits with icing.

Icing of your choice.

## PRESERVES - SPECIAL CLASS

Use the following recipe:

### Class 7062 **Marmalade** - 1 jar

4 large grapefruit

2 large lemons

3.5 litres water

Sugar

Finely mince, chop, or slice fruit and cover with water and stand overnight. Next day boil for 45 minutes or until fruit is soft and pulpy. Allow to cool a little. Measure pulp and return to pan. Bring to the boil. For each cup of pulp add one cup of sugar. Stir until sugar has dissolved then boil briskly, stirring occasionally until setting point is reached. Pour into sterilized jars.
