RULES AND REGULATIONS

General Rules and Regulations for the governance and conduct of the Pukekohe Show shall be those issued by the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ Inc and it shall be deemed as if they had been printed in full in this Schedule. If any Exhibitor is not sure of the conditions they should get in touch with the Secretary.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Entries per Class:

Entries restricted to **2 entries** per class unless otherwise stated. Please read each class details carefully. EXHIBITS may be entered in ONE class only.

How to Enter:

Entries accepted via ShowdayOnline or through the office in person 9.30am to 4pm daily, or by email to accounts@pukekoheshowgrounds.co.nz.

Entry Fee Payment:

Late Entries and Refunds:

Late entries **will not be accepted**. No refunds will be given for non-participation after payment has been made.

Exhibitor Passes:

Exhibitors who enter 5 or more entries are entitled to a free One Day Pass to the Show. Passes may be collected from the Main Office prior to the Show.

Prize Money:

If the prize involves money, this will be paid via direct credit into the winner's nominated bank account at the completion of the show. The Society reserves the right to alter the amount of prize money relevant to entrant numbers in each Class. The Society reserves the right to substitute advertised prize money with either product or vouchers. A prize giving will be held at 3pm Sunday to present trophies, sashes and take photos.

Privacy Act:

The Society records the names and addresses of all members and exhibitors and will publish these as necessary for media show reports unless advised.

Bona Fide Work:

Exhibits must be the bona fide work of the entrant and may not have been a previous prize winning entry of the Franklin A & P Show.

Full Disclosure:

Entrants must supply their full name, address, and phone number on entry form. **ALL EXHIBITS MUST HAVE A TICKET** with class number on one side and exhibitor name and Entry on the other, not the entrant number. The names of the winners may be published.

Points:

Where points prizes are awarded, points will be: 1st = 6, 2nd = 4, 3rd = 2.

Disclaimer:

It may be necessary to make changes to the programme, prizes, or judges because of circumstances beyond our control. No correspondence will be entered into.

Sportsmanship:

The purpose of our show is to provide our community and visiting competitors the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and competition, therefore any person or persons who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow competitors, stewards, judges or show officials may be asked, at the discretion of the show committee, to leave the Showgrounds.

Closing Dates for Entries:

All Entries Close: 4pm Monday 16 February 2026

Date and Time for Delivering Exhibits: Stewards are available to receive exhibits in Massey Hall at the following time:

Non Perishable Entries: 4pm Wednesday 18 February 2026

Perishable Entries: 4pm Friday 20 February 2026

Date and Time for Collecting Exhibits at

Completion of Show:

Exhibitors will be able to collect their exhibits for the Home Industry section from Massey Hall on Sunday 22 February 2026 from 3.30pm until 5.00pm. No vehicles will be allowed on the grounds until the Show has been closed to the public. Tow away rules will be in force prior to this time.

Please ensure ALL entries are collected from Massey Hall by 1.00pm on Monday 23 February 2026.

NOTE: People collecting exhibits must produce an Entry Form or other form of identification. Exhibits will not be released without this.

NOTE: Due to health regulations, all perishable goods (food and vegetables) will be disposed of at the close of the show.

Time of Judging and Judging Rules:

Non Perishable exhibits will be judged after 4.00pm on Wednesday 18 February 2026.

Perishable exhibits will be judged after 4.00pm on Friday 20 February 2026.

The Society reserves the right to verify suitability of exhibits in classes. Where appropriate exhibits may be transferred to another class or disqualified.

Classes may be cancelled or merged if there are insufficient entries at the Society's, Judge's, or Head Steward's discretion.

As this year's theme is "Transport" points are given to entrants who follow the theme over those who do not.

Judges will be accompanied by Stewards only. No visitors are allowed in Massey Hall during judging.

JUDGE'S DECISIONS ARE FINAL. If entries are deemed to not be up to standard, prizes will not be awarded.

Insurance:

The Franklin A & P Society will not under any circumstances be held responsible for loss, damage or mis-delivery of goods exhibited at the Show.

Event Cancellation:

If the show is abandoned or postponed due to any reason beyond the control of the Society, the Society is under no obligation to refund in whole or in part any payments made by the Exhibitors. Any refund will be made at the discretion of the Franklin Agricultural and Pastoral Society.

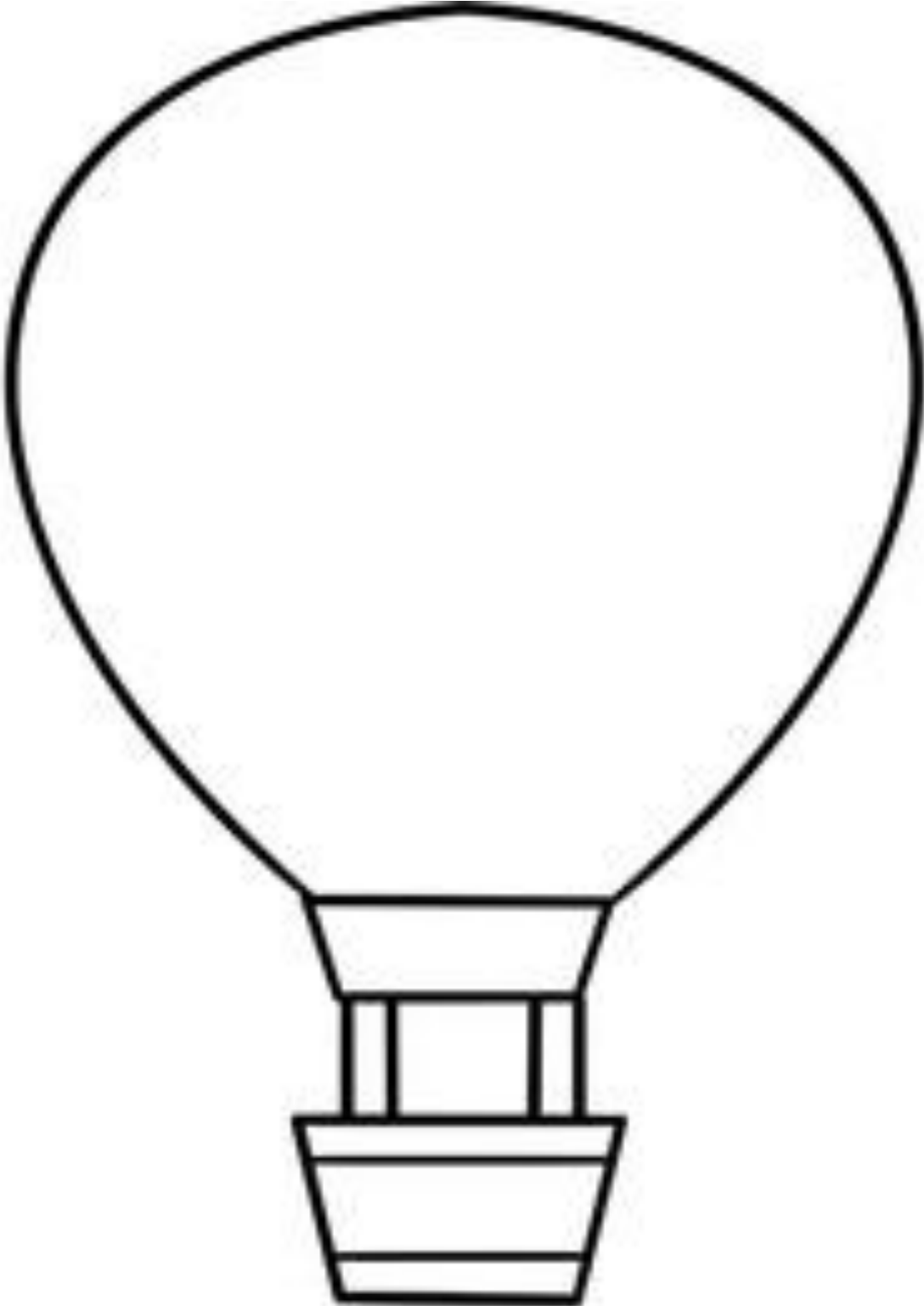
